VITAL REGISTRATION OFFICE RULE 11.1 DISCLOSURE OF DATA and CERTIFIED COPIES

West Virginia Legislative Rules for Vital Statistics, Section 11, restricts access to information or certified copies as follows:

1. BIRTH RECORDS: The registrant, his/her immediate family, guardians, or their legal representatives.

Immediate family includes:

- Mother or Father**(See Note Below)
- Son or Daughter
- Brother or Sister
- Husband or Wife
- Mother-in-Law/Father-in-Law
- Son-in-Law/Daughter-in-Law
- Grandparents
- Grandchildren
- Stepmother or Stepfather
- Stepchild
- 2. FETAL DEATH REPORTS: The PARENTS listed on the fetal death report or their legal representatives.
- 3. DEATH RECORDS: Any surviving relative having a direct and tangible interest or their legal representative.
- 4. MARRIAGE & DIVORCE: The parties involved and their adult children over 18 years of age.

^{**} If father's name is not shown on the birth certificate, he or his family cannot obtain certified copies of a birth record without a court order or court ordered paternity determination.
